Public Notice is hereby given to the electors of the District of Logan Lake regarding advance elector registration, the list of registered electors, nominations for elected office and applications to act as a scrutineer for the TV Society assent voting.

NOTICE OF NOMINATION

Public Notice is hereby given to the electors of the District of Logan Lake that nominations will be accepted for the following offices:

Mayor — one person to be elected

Councillor — six persons to be elected

Nomination documents will be accepted from 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, September 1, 2026, until 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 11, 2026.

All nomination documents must be received by the Chief Election Officer or a designated person before the nomination deadline. Office submissions will be accepted during regular office hours, excluding weekends and statutory holidays. Candidates are responsible for ensuring that mailed, emailed or faxed documents are received by the deadline.

Nomination packages are available from the District Office as of August 12, 2026.

A person is qualified to be nominated, elected and to hold office if that person:

- is 18 years of age or older on General Voting Day;
- is a Canadian citizen;
- has been a resident of British Columbia for at least six months immediately before submitting nomination documents; and
- is not disqualified under the Local Government Act or any other enactment from being nominated for, elected to or holding the office, or otherwise disqualified by law.

The candidate expense limits for the 2026 General Local Election are:

- Mayor: \$12,323.78
- Councillor: \$6,161.89

The third-party advertising expense limits are:

- Directed advertising limit for the District of Logan Lake: \$924.28
- Cumulative third-party advertising limit: \$184,856.70

LIST OF REGISTERED ELECTORS

Beginning Tuesday, September 1, 2026, and continuing until the close of general voting on Saturday, October 17, 2026, the list of registered electors will be available for public inspection at the District Office during regular office hours. A person inspecting the list must sign a statement that the information will not be used except as permitted under the Local Government Act.

An elector may request that personal information about the elector be omitted from, or obscured on, the list available for public inspection.

An objection to the registration of a person whose name appears on the list of registered electors must be received before 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 11, 2026. An objection may be made only by a person entitled to be registered as an elector of the District of Logan Lake and only on the basis that the person whose registration is questioned has died or, at the time of the objection, is not qualified to be registered as an elector. An objection must be in writing, signed by the objector and include the information required by section 79 of the Local Government Act.

CLOSE OF ADVANCE ELECTOR REGISTRATION

Are you eligible to vote in the October election for the District of Logan Lake? Is your name on the current list of electors?

If you are not sure you can find out by calling or visiting the District of Logan Lake, #1 Opal Drive, 250-523-6225. The office is open from Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. (Closed from 12:30 p.m. to 1:00 p.m. and on statutory holidays)

Applications for advance elector registration must be received by the District of Logan Lake no later than 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, August 25, 2026. Advance elector registration will be closed beginning Tuesday, August 25, 2026. Eligible electors who are not registered in advance may register at the time of voting.

To register as a resident elector, a person must:

- be 18 years of age or older on General Voting Day, October 17, 2026;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- have been a resident of British Columbia for at least six months immediately before registering;
- be a resident of the District of Logan Lake; and
- not be disqualified by the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law.

To register as a non-resident property elector, a person must:

- be 18 years of age or older on General Voting Day;
- be a Canadian citizen;
- have been a resident of British Columbia for at least six months immediately before registering;
- have been a registered owner of real property in the District of Logan Lake for at least 30 days immediately before registering;
- not be entitled to register as a resident elector in the District; and
- not be disqualified by the Local Government Act or any other enactment from voting in an election or otherwise disqualified by law.

Only individuals may register as non-resident property electors. Corporations are not eligible. If a property is owned by more than one individual, only one owner may register as the non-resident property elector and must have the written consent of a majority of the other owners.

Advance registration applications are available from the District Office.

NOTICE OF APPLICATIONS TO VOLUNTEER AS SCRUTINEER — TV SOCIETY ASSENT VOTING

On Saturday, October 17, 2026, qualified electors of the District of Logan Lake will be asked to vote on the following question:

“Are you in favour of the District of Logan Lake adopting a bylaw to repeal The District of Logan Lake Television Society Grant-in-Aid Bylaw No. 229, 1984, which would end the annual frontage tax used to fund the television rebroadcasting services currently in use beginning in 2028?”

Qualified electors who wish to volunteer to act as a scrutineer in favour of or opposed to the question may submit an application to the Chief Election Officer.

Applications will be accepted from 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, September 1, 2026, until 4:00 p.m. on Friday, September 11, 2026.
