



Grants-In-Aid

Council of the District of Logan Lake is now accepting applications from local non-profit groups and organizations that qualify for Grants-In-Aid for 2022. All applications must be submitted in writing prior to 4:00 pm, March 31, 2022 to be considered for this year.

Application Requirements

All applicants:

1. Must be residents of Logan Lake;
2. Must use the Application Form provided;
3. Must be a non-profit organization whereby private or personal gain is absent;
4. Must provide a budget detailing the use of the grant funds;
5. Must submit its most recent financial statements;
6. If successful, must submit a Project Completion Report;
7. If successful, must direct the grant to the intended program, project, or service. Grants are not transferrable.

Grant-In-Aid application forms are available for pick-up at the District office at 1 Opal Drive or on the District's website at www.loganlake.ca/finance-department.

5. Council directed Staff research and report back regarding Territorial Land Acknowledgements in other communities;
6. Council approved changes to Civic Pride & Flag Raising Day Policy;
7. Council approved the Purchasing Policy;
8. Council repealed the Gas Card Policy;
9. Council deferred discussion on outdoor patio expansion opportunities to a EPRB Committee Mtg;
10. Council approved housekeeping items on the Strategic Plan;
11. Council approved that they have access to electronic Council Mtg agendas and minutes;
12. Council approved COTW meetings be held monthly beginning in March 2022;
13. Council directed Staff coordinate a meeting with School District 73;
14. Council directed Staff to investigate Passenger Carrier License Regulations;
15. Council directed Staff to investigate the pros/cons of initiating a Development Corporation;
16. Council approved the sitting of Parcel Tax Roll Review Panel for Tues., March 29, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. in Council Chambers;
17. Council approved that Staff send a letter to Jason Stewart & Mike Carlsen, LL Men's Hockey College Program to inform them that the District looks forward to working with them;
18. Council directed Staff work with the LL Men's College Hockey Program to determine exact needs & prepare a report on options & potential financial implications.
19. Council gave 1, 2 & 3 reading to Five Year Financial Plan Amendment Bylaw No. 880, 2022.
1. Council approved the 2022 Annual Budget Meeting be scheduled for Mon., April 11, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. in Council Chambers;
2. Council approved recommended COVID-19 Safe Restart Reserve Fund Continuity Spreadsheet;
3. Council allocated \$30,000 for the update/installation of a new sound system at the Rec. Centre;
4. Council allocated \$10,000 to update the Kitchen within the Community Centre;
5. Council directed Staff reach out to the LL RCMP Detachment to inquire about Victim Services;
6. Council approved that Committees' Structure, Functions and Budgets be reviewed at the next COTW meeting;
7. Council directed Staff to prepare a new Travel Expense and Council Remuneration Bylaw revising rates of remuneration for Council by +2.7%, as per Council Policy and increase auto allowance rates to \$.61/km;
8. Council allocated \$5,000 for website maintenance costs;
9. Council allocated \$22,500 to update Municipal Hall;
10. Council allocated \$15,000 to install A/C in the PW Office and gas heat in the Quonset Hut;
11. Council allocated \$150,000 to update the fencing, entrance area and pathways in the Cemetery;
12. Council allocated \$7,000 to repair The Raven, The Beaver and The Frog carvings in the parks;
13. Council allocated \$1,225,000 from the Ec Dev Fund and \$330,000 from General Surplus to complete Phase 3c & preliminary planning of Phase 4 of Ironstone Subdivision through a RFP;
14. Council approved all projects for Campground Maintenance & Upgrades;
15. Council approved 2022/23 Service Agreements for the LL WHY and LL Arts Council, and 2022/23 Service Agreement for LL SAR.
1. Council forwarded a letter regarding preventative burning in Logan Lake to the Fire Chief for information;
2. Council proclaimed March 26, 2022 as BC Epilepsy Day in the District of Logan Lake;
3. Council directed Staff send a letter to communities in the Nicola Watershed inquiring if there is an interest in water quality data sharing;
