Regular Council Highlights – April 5, 8, 19, 2022

- Council referred the Logan Lake Sasquatch Lacrosse Association request to amend the Rec Centre User Fees to staff for review;
- 2. Council approved letter 105 from Susan Mulkey, BC Community Forest Association;
- 3. Council approved that a letter be sent to L. Viezzer informing them that the District of Logan Lake is reviewing current animal control bylaws in regards to the keeping of chickens and roosters in the municipality and their feedback has been received for consideration;
- 4. Council approved the 50th Anniversary Committee selection of the Gold Key;
- 5. Council authorized staff explore funding options to have engineered drawings procured at a cost of \$10,000 \$20,000 to modify the current dressing rooms in the portables to a full structured addition for dressings room at the back of the Recreation Centre;
- 6. Council approved the TV Society Agreement be renewed for a further three years (2022-2024);
- 7. Council approved an application to the UBCM Community-2-Community (C2C) Forum funding for \$5,000;
- 8. Council gave 3 readings to District of Logan Lake TV Society Grant-in-Aid (GIA) Frontage Tax Bylaw No. 882, 2022;
- 1. Council approved the fencing of the Breccia Reservoir;
- 2. Council approved an increase to the water utility rates by 2.8% in 2022;
- Council approved Water Operating Fund (WOF) Supplementary Budget Items & contributions to reserves from Surplus in the WOF increase from \$35,800 to \$45,800;
- 4. Council approve \$10,000 from the Sewer Operating Fund (SOF) Surplus for a Wastewater Master Plan;
- 5. Council approved the Sewer Operating Fund Supplement Budget Items;
- 6. Council approved the replacement of 2 overhead doors at the Recreation Centre;
- 7. Council approved \$150,000 be allocated from the General Operating Fund Surplus to the Recreation Centre Reserve;
- 8. Council approved \$2,000 to purchase a portable video conference camera;
- 9. Council approved the GIA request from the Logan Lake Lions of \$1,000;
- 10. Council approved the GIA request from the Logan Lake Citizens on Patrol of \$3,600.00;
- 11. Council invited the LL WHY to a COTW meeting and provide more info on the uses of the GIA operating grant;
- 12. Council approved the Grant-in-Kind (GIK) request from the Logan Lake Lions Club of \$11,200.00;
- 13. Council approved Staff review reoccurring annual GIK Rqst from nonprofit organization to see if Rqsts can be incorporated in the annual OP expenses; 14. Council approved the GIK request from Logan Lake Lacrosse of \$4,129.00;
- 15. Council authorized Staff review the current Recreation Centre operating structure and report to Council on operating time, user fees, and ways to increase accessibility to as many groups and organizations as possible throughout all four seasons;
- 16. Council approved \$16,000 to purchase LGMA Start Pack Built-out Digi Filing Sys; and Bgt \$4,250 (+3%/year) annually for Ricoh Municipal Site License;
- 17. Council approved purchase of 2 Gas monitors and 2 Ammonia Monitors;
- 18. Council approved the build of a shed at 120 Chartrand Place;
- 19. Council approved \$4,400 for Camera Solution #1 and Staff report back on any additional costs;
- 20. Council referred the discussion on recreation opportunities and total project cost of \$350,000 to Committee of the Whole meeting;
- 21. Council approved \$50,000 for development of a Recreation Master Plan with options for tennis, outdoor hockey, lacrosse, skateboard park and other recreation activities;
- 22. Council approved \$20,000 for the moving of the fence line along the Ironstone subdivision;
- 23. Council approved \$25,000 for the purchase and installation of a two-post lift at Public Works;
- 24. Council approved \$70,000 to sand blast, paint and lighting improvements for Truck & Shovel; and change paint colours to District of Logan Lake branding; 25. Council approved the 10-Year Vehicle Replacement Plans and increase for annual contributions by \$20,000;
- 26. Council approved the 10-1 car venice replacement hans and inclease for annual contributions by \$20, 26. Council approved \$75,000 in 2022 for the Wildfire Trailer and Box and Sanding Unit replacements;
- 27. Council approved \$253,000 for the paving of Jasper Drive and the Campground Pullout;
- 28. Council approved an increase to the solid waste and recycling rates by 2.8% in 2022;
- 29. Council approved an increase to the municipal tax rates by 2.8% in 2022;
- 30. Council approved \$50,000 to the Crushed Gravel Reserve;
- 31. Council approved \$40,000 for lighting and signage at the entrance sign at the campground;
- 32. Council approved \$5,000 for office furnishings;
- 33. Council approved up to \$30,000 for no-posts, gate and signage in the upper parking lot at the Campground;
- 34. Council increased the LL 50th Anniversary Celebration budget by \$5,000;
- 35. Council approved \$10,000 for the Tremont Creek Commemorative Event;
- 36. Council approved \$20,000 for Engineered drawings for permanent dressing rooms at the Arena;
- 37. Council approved the Late GIK from the LL Lions Club of \$280;
- 1. Mayor Robin Smith, Jean Finlay, Karen Lindsey, Laurel Grimm, & Randi Brown (TECK) appointed to the Tremont Creek Wildfire Commem. Committee;
- 2. Council approved the issuance of a Development Variance Permit for 263 Gowan Dr. to vary the District of Logan Lake Zoning Bylaw;
- 3. Council approved in principle the request from Logan Lake Laugh & Learn Society for use of District tents, tables and chairs, hot beverage carafes, and sound system for the Grand Opening of the Daycare; that the applicant submit a Grant-in-Kind request for the use of the equipment;
