





The course of study is offered by evening lectures at the Faculty of Commerce and Business Administration, or may be taken by correspondence by those beyond the Lower Mainland. Applications for this special winter semester will now be accepted by the Registrar for students having completed Grade XII on the University Entrance or the Commercial (Accountancy Specialty) programs.
