**Regular Council Meeting Highlights  
July 12, 2022**

1. Council authorized that a letter of support be sent to the Town of Gibsons regarding a Union of BC Municipalities resolution for Hospice Services Funding;
2. Council authorized that a letter of support be sent to the City of New Westminster regarding a resolution to be considered at the Union of BC Municipalities convention regarding a Library Funding request for 2023;
3. Council authorized that a letter be sent to Century House confirming that the District of Logan Lake supports their effort in restructuring how we care for the elderly, and their webinar held on September 22, 2021 on "Right Person, Right Time, Right Place", and that the system requires a complete overhaul embracing the philosophy of "Aging in Place" where choices and options for care are available to all citizens;
4. Council approved the Permissive Tax Exemption Policy term be amended from a period of 1 year to 3 years;
5. Council authorized that staff prepare a Policy regarding 50 Year Resident recognition; and that the report be reviewed by Council at a September 2022 meeting;
6. Council approved that the Tremont Creek Wildfire Commemorative Event take place on August 19, 2022; that Council approve purchasing a bench, plaque, interpretive sign and radio advertising in the amount of \$10,000 to honour everyone who contributed to protecting Logan Lake opened their homes and hearts to all those displaced by the disaster; and that Staff is authorized to submit a request to the Highland Valley Copper Community Investment Fund in the amount of \$5,000 for sponsorship of food and refreshments for the Tremont Creek Wildfire Commemorative Event;
7. Council authorized that a report on Freedom of Information requests be brought forth for information semi-annually;
8. Council directed staff to move forward with producing and updating lease agreements for all four requests using the connectivity plan budget to facilitate expert consultations;
9. THAT staff move forward with updating lease agreements with nicolaNet as follows: streetlight pilot project of the Cambium technology be brought out of pilot phase and a lease agreement around pole rental rates be developed to enable expansion of the project; the current lease agreement for equipment located up at the ski trails be amended to allow for a 40ft tower; and that the District lease out conduit space in the Ironstone area for nicolaNet to pull fiber through, these rates are established through the CRTC and a lease to be created around this;
10. Council approved the 2022-2023 Service Agreement for the Logan Lake SAR Society in the amount of \$3,690 per year;
11. Council authorized staff to dispose of the records identified in the "Inactive Records for Destruction in 2022" list;
12. Council authorized Staff to move forward with all the recommendations as outlined in the Connectivity Report as prepared by Planetworks.

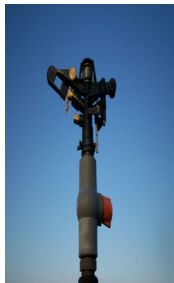

### Beat the Heat!

With hot weather approaching make sure you know the risks and where you can find help if you need it.

During heat warnings, it's important to check in on loved ones and neighbours to make sure they're staying hydrated and spending time in cool spaces. If you live alone, it's smart to have a buddy who can check in on you.

Heat-related illness can occur in homes that aren't able to stay cool during extreme heat events. Plan ahead by identifying places in your community you can visit to get cool, such as libraries, shopping malls, or community cooling centres. If there is an extreme heat event the District has a cooling centre plan in place. If you would like more information on this, please contact the [District of Logan Lake](#).

A few basic modifications to your home can make a big difference during periods of extreme heat:

- Install a window air conditioner in at least one room
- Install thermal curtains or window coverings
- Use a digital thermometer to measure indoor temperatures (31°C or higher is dangerous for vulnerable people)
- Have fans available to help move cooler air indoors during the late evening and early morning hours
- Install a heat pump
